For more than 7 years pastors, lay leaders, missionaries and other fellow believers have prayed for revival on Pine Ridge; a true breaking of the Spiritual bondage that stifles hope. "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age..." Eph. 6:12. Joe Cross, HFM assistant director, has been very involved in all phases of planning this event. We are praying God will move to break the bondage and that many Lakota will not only come to believe for salvation but also spread this Good News throughout America. Impossible, not with our God! COMING TOGETHER

Through the Covid Pandemic, Hands of Faith has remained open and because of this has been one of the few venues that people from the Pine Ridge have been able to gather at. The Lakota House of Worship, bible study groups, the BGEA trainings and prayers times have been some of the gatherings taking place in the Warrior center.

MISSION HOUSE

A team of seven men from Faith Lutheran located in St. Louis, Missouri, provided the supplies and worked side by side with Lakota men in constructing a new mission building at the HFM site. The 16x44 mission house will be multi-purpose and house mission teams, staff-at times, and other guests. It is located where the three trailers used to sit. The site will also include three more drive through RV hookups. To finish this project we need \$4000 for a septic system and water lines and \$6000 for interior wiring, plumbing fixtures, insulation and sheet rock. If you want to help donate towards these supplies, put "mission house" on your check. Funds are needed ASAP so it could be used for the July 3 & 4 BGEA Celebration. RV hookups cost about \$780/ site. Please help, thanks.



Delano, a Lakota from Pine Ridge helped work on footings, foundation, framing and multiple other ways in Building the Warrior Center. In February of last year he was struck by a pickup in Rapid City while crossing a street. After months of hospitalization and rehab he was able to walk but needed more time to get stronger. He came to Hands of Faith and with good food, diligent weight training he was able to regain most of the 50 lbs. he had lost. Bible studies and prayers strengthen him spiritually and he has now got his children with him in Pine Ridge, he is now able to work on the mission house and be employed. Praise God for his physical healing and spiritual growth.

KEYSTONE PROJECT

Four men who previously were or are presently in our HFM program, along with Henry Brown and Atta Jack, attended the Keystone Bible Training project, May 16-21. These trainings have been previously attended by our men and have proven to be very effective in training the men on Christian principles. It also provides them an opportunity to be in the beautiful Black Hills and enjoy good food and fellowship with other believers.

CONFERENCES

Joe Cross and Atta Jack attended the International Chaplaincy Training in Montana in April. They are both finalizing their certification process. This will enable them to go into prisons, hospitals and various other venues to minister to people. Thank you to the Converse family who paid for the cost for them to attend the training!

I am planning, God willing, to attend the Gospel Rescue Mission Fellowship national conference in Ashville, N. Carolina, June 21-24. This will be held at "The Cove" which is the BGEA training Center. It may be no coincidence that we will be going there at the same time we are working with them to host the Celebration on the Pine Ridge. "Man plans His ways but God directs his steps". Prov.16:9

The Unity in Christ Conference, planned for July 15-17 in Bemidji, Minnesota, hosts Native leaders from around the U.S. and Canada. This will also include missionaries serving in these Native areas. HFM staff will be attending to gain insight into how other ministries work and to receive materials and ideas in building our recovery and discipleship ministry. Pray for a powerful unified building up of the body of Christ.
